# Funding for Sports groups

## National Lottery Awards for All

 **£300 - £20,000**

Our broadest source of funding - improving community, arts and sports activities.

## Young Start

 **£20,000 - £100,000**

Helping young people aged 8 to 24 to become more confident and play an active part in realising their potential.

## Fairer Life Chances

 **£20,001 - £500,000**

For projects that support children, young people and families. Or that help people to be healthier or have better access to support.

## Community Action

 **£20,001 - £250,000**

For projects bringing communities together around activities that matter to them to improve wellbeing and develop positive relationships within those communities. They should help people connect with each other and/or the environment.

For these two funding programmes, projects must involve people who most experience poverty, disadvantage or discrimination.

National Lottery Awards for All: main source of funding for groups if the focus of an application is sports participation and performance.

Larger Funds: Can consider these programmes if you're intending to use sport as a 'hook' to engage people. It's important that there's a focus beyond sport and aims to address particular social issues.

Funding for **community-led** projects

- Simple to apply for **£300** to **£20,000**. And can support projects for up to **2 years**.

Funding for **arts and sports** projects

- Can apply for **£300** to **£10,000**. And can support projects for up to **12 months**.

For both, funding is broad: community, sports, events, equipment, promotion, start-up costs etc. Focus on involving your community

You can apply for funding to deliver a new or existing activity or to support your organisation to change and adapt to new and future challenges.

We work in partnership with sportscotland and Creative Scotland to deliver some of the National Lottery Awards for All funding. So for projects based in Scotland, we can offer:

### Funding for community-led projects

- We offer funding from £300 to £20,000. And can support your project for up to 2 years.

### Funding for arts and sports projects

- We offer funding from £300 to £10,000. And can support your project for up to 12 months.
- We run this funding in partnership with sportscotland and Creative Scotland.

# Who can apply?

- ✓ Voluntary or community organisation
- ✓ Registered charity
- ✓ Constituted group or club
- ✓ Not-for-profit company or Community Interest Company
- ✓ School (as long as your project benefits and involves the communities around the school)
- ✓ Statutory bodies (including town, parish and community council)

# Who can't we accept applications from?

- X individuals
- X sole traders
- X companies that can pay profits to directors, shareholders or members (including Companies Limited by Shares)
- X organisations based outside the UK
- X organisations that have already sent a National Lottery Awards for All Scotland application and are waiting for a decision
- X one organisation applying on behalf of another
- X organisations that currently have a National Lottery Awards for All Scotland grant which is not finished

## PRIORTIES

- young people from deprived areas - so places where there might be social and financial restrictions to sport and physical activities, lack of facilities and equipment to enable participation, or issues connecting young people with crime
- girls and young women
- young people with disabilities.

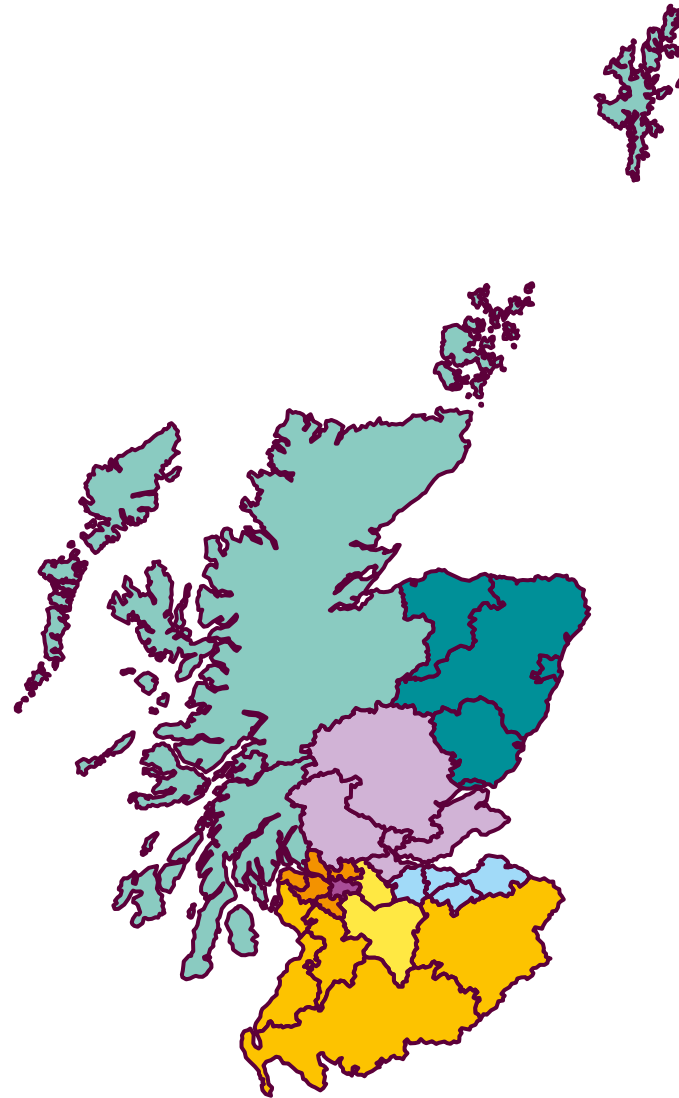


# What can't we fund?

- X political or religious activities
- X profit-making or fundraising activities
- X VAT you can reclaim
- X statutory activities
- X overseas travel.
